Description

Ebony Grey is a Greek marble. The word "marble" is derived from the traditional appellation "marmaros" which means *resplendent stone*. Ancient Greece was rich in marble quarries. Mostly known for its greyish-white marbles, used by many sculptors and famous Greek architects in majestic creations such as the Diane of Versailles sculpture or the monuments of Athens, Greece also includes a variety of marble colors featuring pinks, greens and chocolatey browns such as the Ebony Grey. This stone has a rich dark brown coloration enhanced with white veining, adding warmth and elegance to the homes of those who will have the opportunity to include it in their designs.

In the course of the polishing process, an epoxy resin is applied to the stone's surface to fill part of its porosity (or pores) and natural cracks that may be apparent. This has no incident on the durability, the maintenance or the beauty of the natural stone. It is possible that certain pores are too small to contain efficiently the resin, and reopen during the finishing stages. However, this does not affect the stone's quality or beauty. Such as it is the case with many natural stones, it is recommended to apply a sealer to extend its beauty through time.
